Lisa M. Donofrio, MD

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Lisa M. Donofrio, MD is a graduate of Quinnipiac University and Tulane University School of Medicine, USA. She completed an internship in Internal Medicine and a residency in Dermatology at Tulane where she also served as Chief Resident. While at Tulane, Dr Donofrio trained with renowned instructors in the fields of dermatologic and cosmetic surgery, and was recipient of the Peterkin Award for excellence in research.

Dr. Donofrio is board certified in Dermatology and is in private practice at the Savin Center for Dermatology and Cosmetic Surgery in New Haven and Branford, CT. Dr. Donofrio doesn't limit herself to Connecticut. She started her latest practice in New Orleans just last spring and has been performing her unique services in New York City on and off for the past several years. She is an Associate Clinical Professor of Dermatology at Yale University School of Medicine and an Assistant Clinical Professor of Dermatology at Tulane University School of Medicine. Dr Donofrio is an assistant editor of the Journal of Dermatologic Surgery and is an active member of the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery serving as a board member and Chair of the 2007 Annual Meeting. Dr Donofrio is also a member of the American Society of Liposuction Surgery and a fellow of the American Academy of Dermatology.

Dr Donofrio has conducted cancer research at Yale Medical School in the departments of Pathology and Therapeutic Radiology, and has several publications on structural fat transfer, liposuction, fillers and surgical technique. She is a frequent lecturer and invited speaker at numerous international and domestic dermatology and surgery meetings.



Derek H. Jones, MD

Course Co-Director

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Derek H. Jones, MD, board-certified in dermatology, received his medical degree from Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, TX, and completed his dermatology residency at Columbia University in New York City, where he served as Chief Resident. In 1999 he founded Skin Care and Laser Physicians of Beverly Hills, where he is the Director. As Clinical Associate Professor of Medicine at the University of California, Los Angeles, Dr Jones is an internationally regarded key opinion leader and researcher in minimally invasive facial aesthetics. He is frequently an invited speaker at prestigious dermatology meetings and has delivered more than 200 scholarly lectures internationally.

Dr Jones is a widely published author, with more than 70 publications in leading peer-reviewed medical journals. He has written several textbook chapters and is editor of the acclaimed textbook *Injectable Fillers: Principles and Practice* (Wiley-Blackwell). Dr Jones also serves on the editorial boards of *Journal of Dermatologic Surgery, Aesthetic Surgery and Medicine, and Journal of Cosmetic and Laser Therapy*.

Dr Jones has served as principal investigator on many clinical trials in facial aesthetics, including the trials that led to FDA approval of Juvéderm®, Latisse®, Belotero®, and Xeomin®. His current FDA research focuses on novel fillers that volumize the midface and injectable adipolytic products. Dr Jones is a fellow of the American Academy of Dermatology and American Society for Dermatologic Surgery, and serves on numerous leadership committees for both.

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Timothy C. Flynn, MD

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Timothy Corcoran Flynn, M.D. is a Fellow of the American College of Mohs Micrographic Surgery and Cutaneous Oncology and a Diplomat of the American Board of Dermatology. Dr. Flynn has always been interested in learning, starting life as an “academic brat” with two university professor parents. Dr. Flynn graduated early from the University of Missouri-Columbia School of Medicine in 1982 and did a dermatopathology research fellowship at Harvard Medical School. He then completed an internal medicine residency at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. His dermatology residency was at Stanford University Medical Center where he served as Chief Resident. Finishing his Mohs Micrographic Surgery fellowship at Washington University, he moved to Tulane University in New Orleans and developed Tulane’s Mohs Micrographic Surgery Program. He was honored to be in New Orleans dermatologic community, rich with outstanding dermatologic surgeons and exemplary collegiality.

Dr. Flynn has been in full-time private practice in North Carolina since 2001, specializing in Mohs Micrographic Surgery and Cosmetic Dermatology as Medical Director at the Cary Skin Center. He holds a Clinical Professor appointment in the dermatology department at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Believing that education can be fun and exciting, he enjoys teaching and training the residents.

Dr. Flynn is affiliated with numerous professional societies. He has served on the board of directors of the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery and has served as past Secretary. He is a member of many dermatologic societies, nationally and internationally, and has held office in the International Academy of Cosmetic Dermatology and the South Central Dermatologic Congress. He has received several awards, including the Young Physician Alumni Award from his alma mater, an excellence in education award from the ASDS, and was thrilled to win the coveted Iron Surgeon Medal in 2009.

Dr. Flynn has served on multiple editorial boards. He has over 125 publications and 182 abstracts. He enjoys teaching and lecturing and most often speaks on botulinum toxins, fillers as well as cutaneous oncology and reconstruction.



Kavita Mariwalla, MD

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Dr. Kavita Mariwalla is an Assistant Clinical Professor of Dermatology at SUNY at Stony Brook and in private practice in New York. She received her BA with distinction, and MD degree from Yale University where she graduated at the top of her class as a member of the Alpha Omega Alpha national medical honor society. Dr. Mariwalla spent her intern year at Harvard’s Massachusetts General Hospital and then returned to Yale for her residency in Dermatology where she served as a Chief Resident. After residency, she pursued a fellowship in Mohs micrographic surgery and procedural dermatology also at Yale.

Dr. Mariwalla has lectured widely and published several peer-reviewed journal articles, book chapters and two editions of an academic textbook covering topics ranging from dermatologic surgery and skin cancer to the latest in aesthetic rejuvenation techniques. Her techniques on facial rejuvenation have been featured on Medscape and she regularly participates in CME meetings to teach young physicians injection techniques.

Having served as a consulting dermatologist to La Roche Posay and Ethicon, Dr. Mariwalla has influenced how patients are educated about their skin and how dermatology residents learn about aesthetics and surgical procedures. Though early in her career, Dr. Mariwalla served as Director of Mohs and Dermatologic Surgery at St. Luke’s – Roosevelt and Beth Israel Medical Centers where she received a faculty teaching award in 2012 as a member of Columbia University’s teaching staff. She was recently the Chair of the Annual Meeting of the American Society for Dermatologic Surgery and serves as Co-Chair of the Service Committee for the Women’s Dermatologic Society. Dr. Mariwalla regularly educates other dermatologists about injection techniques for neuromodulators and fillers and her solo private dermatology practice has been nominated as one of Long Island’s Best in 2012 and 2013. She is listed in Top Doctors and has been featured in Elle, Allure, Prevention, Self, Shape, Men’s Fitness, Redbook and Woman’s Day. She has also appeared on 1010 Wins, National Public Radio, the CBS Early Show, Good Morning America, CBS News in New York and Good Day New York.
